After its election last October your committee began the planning for 2023 and the 30th anniversary for Geelong Writers. This off-spring of Geelong's 'Streets Poets' is proud to be counted among the Gen Y millennials whose dynamic presence is now felt throughout our communities, and in literature and the arts in particular.

It is a proud occasion for Geelong Writers to bestow a life membership on one of its founders who has maintained his commitment and support for our community organisation over the past three decades. Congratulations Dr Ted Reilly.

MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

Our membership continues to grow and Geelong Writers now has 193 members (June 2023). Winner of our mid-year membership drive (July 2022) was Wendy Spall who received a \$100 voucher from The Book Bird, Pakington Street, Geelong West. The number of our social media followers continues to climb beyond 1000.

OUR ACTIVE WRITERS

Many of our members have continued to submit their written work to the growing opportunities for publication in print as well as those for short works of fiction for publication on our website. I thank our members who have made themselves available for profile stories.

Our Belmont Page writing group has remained active and is ably supported by Claudia Collins. Their annual publication will be available before Christmas.

Thanks to the dedication of Jenny Macauley the Dome Poets continued to hone their craft at their regular monthly meetings.

Our 'Shut Up & Write' group continues to meet twice per week from 10:00 am to 12 noon at the Box Office Café in Geelong West. While its numbers ebb and flow from week to week, the participation rate has grown and it attracts an average of about 7 per session. It has become a fount of ideas for new writerly activities as well as providing opportunities for effective mentoring.

To provide encouragement for emerging writers, Geelong Writers has begun a special fund to provide additional modest support for their development through contributions to course fees or mentoring support, for example.

ACHIEVEMENTS

It has been a year of significant achievements for Geelong Writers beginning with the publication of *Different Journeys, Shared Stories*, an anthology of life writings emerging from a project funded by grants from the City of Greater Geelong and Writers Victoria, and facilitated by Natalie Fraser and Amra Pajalic.

- a dynamic new website and social media presence
- a very successful membership drive
- well-supported members' social meetings
- the on-line publication of members' writings
- the publication of our annual anthology
 Eclectic Words 2022 as well as several
 chapbooks, including the, the poetry
 anthology AnoMaly Street Vol 1, No 2 and Vol
 2, No1, our winter solstice challenge, a story
 in 22 words
- regular informative e-zines and Facebook posts
- a series of workshops on poetry, research for writers, and an emerging interest in history writing
