

TREASURER'S REPORT AGM, 17 October 2023 | 6:00 pm | Waurn Ponds Library

At the end of the 2022-2023 financial year, 30 June 2023, Geelong Writers Inc. financial assets were \$6,382.06, which included a bank account balance of \$6,129.81. Income was \$13,903.44, expenditure \$15,300.11, a net loss of \$1,396.67.

Our main income sources were membership fees (\$4,676.40), book sales (\$3,186.20) and donations (\$3,005.19). Our major expense was printing (\$4,251.58). We published two anthologies, two volumes of poetry, two chapbooks and a pamphlet; we also subsidised two member publications, *Azuria10* and a self-published booklet by Belmont Page. The shortfall of \$1,065.38 on publications is slightly less than 2021-22 and proportionally a lot less as our expenditure increased by 56%. We have continued to keep the prices of our publications low, to make them affordable and accessible. Free copies of all publications are given to libraries – the National and State Library as well as Geelong Regional Library Corporation.

We actively sought donations for the first time in 2022-23, enabling us to undertake otherwise unaffordable projects. The most substantial of these was Geelong Writers Prize, a local competition with a \$2,750 prize pool. We also offered workshops at little or no cost to participants.

Many others made smaller but equally important donations: all the extra ten and twenty dollars that came in with membership renewals, entry fees and event bookings added up to over \$580.

The Geelong Writers Fund, a special fund created in May 2021 to support disadvantaged emerging writers and modelled on The Writers Victoria Fund, has now raised a total of \$548.31.

The main reason for this year's net loss is the receipt of funds last financial year – a \$2,000 post-covid recovery grant from the City of Greater Geelong – which were expended in this.
